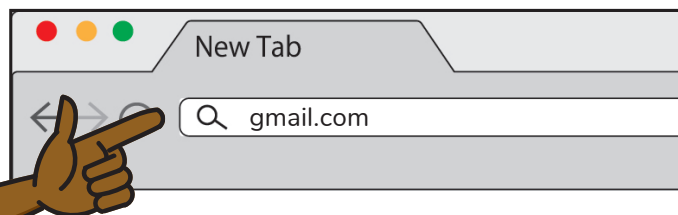
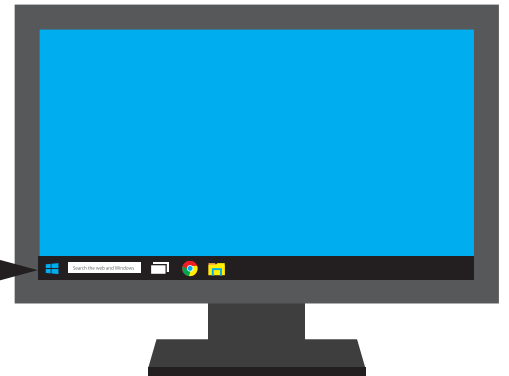


Let's open Gmail



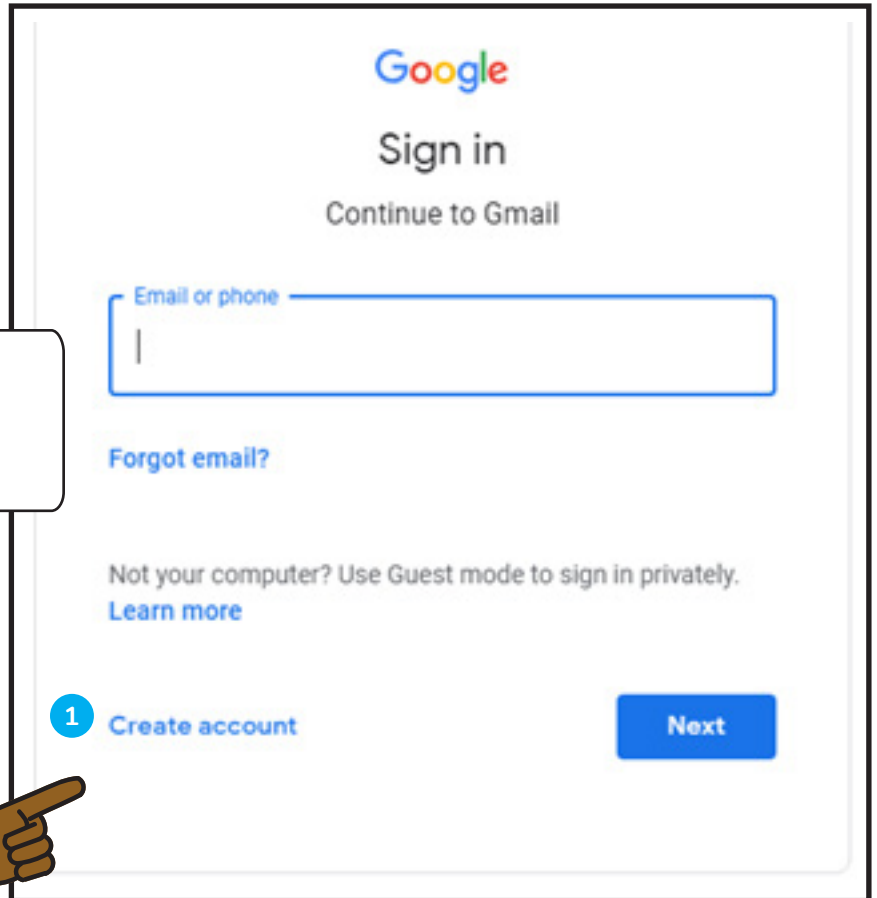
On the bottom of the screen is where we can find Google Chrome. Can you click on it once to open it?



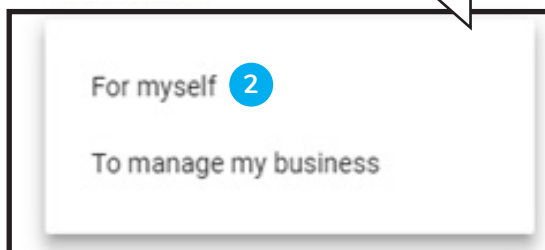
You can get to Gmail by typing **gmail.com** into the address bar. When you're done, press **enter**.

Let's create a Gmail account

First, click on **Create an Account** ¹.



Next, click on **For myself** ².



Create an account



You'll need to type your **first name** **1** and your **last name** here **2**.

Anyone you send an email to will see your name.

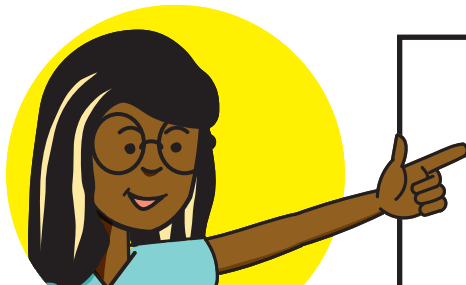

Next, you'll have to pick your **Username** **3**.

This will be your email address. You can't change this after, so make sure you like it! You'll have to choose an email address that isn't already used by someone else.



Your **Password** **1** should be something easy for you to remember and hard for others to guess. Without telling me the password, please type it into the box

Password **1** Confirm **2**

Use 8 or more characters with a mix of letters, numbers & symbols

Retype your password where it says **confirm** **2**. **Don't forget to write your password down somewhere safe so that you remember it!** When you're done, click **Next**



You'll need a cell phone number to confirm your account **1**.

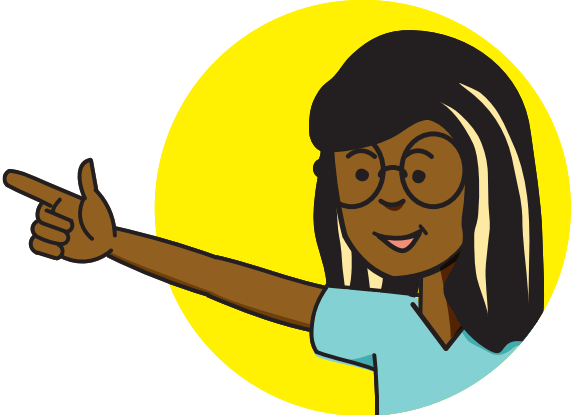
Next, type your birthday **2** and your gender **3**.

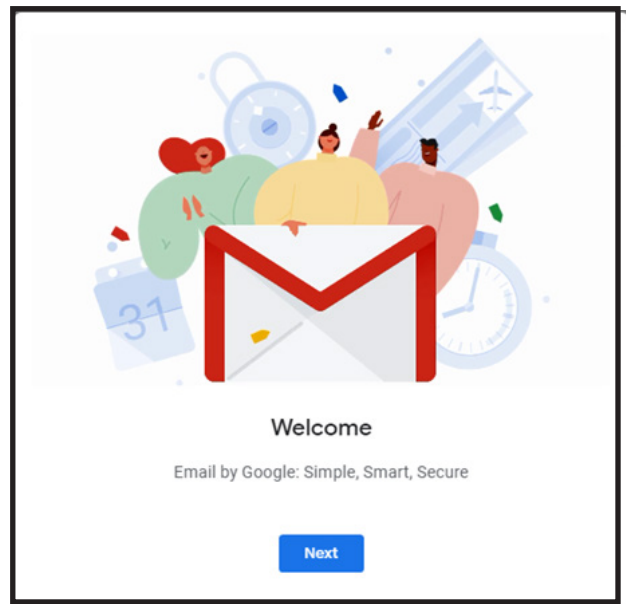
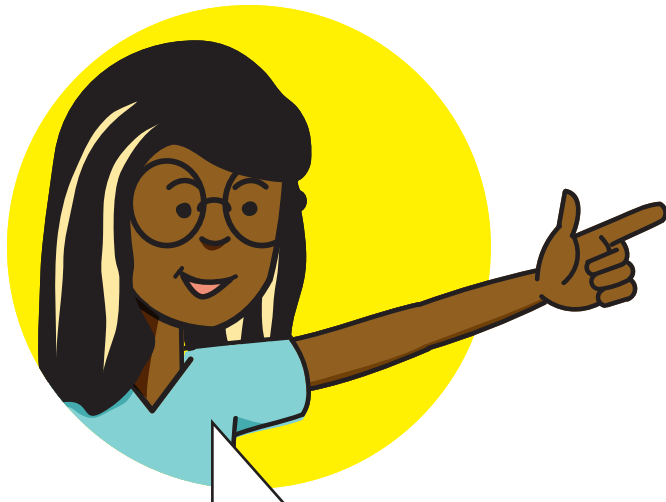
When you're all done, click **Next**
